FOR CONCERNS REGARDING SIGNIFICANT DEVELOPMENTAL DELAYS, MEDICAL CONDITIONS, OR MEDICATION REVIEWS

Please contact your GP for advice and support. Your GP may refer your child to the Community Paediatrician for an assessment if priority concerns are identified as above.



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FOR CONCERNS OF AUTISM AND/OR ADHD - GRADUATED RESPONSE.

If you do not have any of the concerns mentioned above at step 1, please follow the graduated response process <u>Graduated Response</u>. This will be supported by the Healthy Families Team or your child's education lead.

Please note - a diagnosis is <u>not</u> required for **reasonable adjustments** to be put in place to support your child's needs within their education setting.

AUTISM AND/OR ADHD ASSESSMENT

Following the graduated response approach if an assessment need is identified the Healthy Families Team or your child's education lead may refer your child to the GDA pathway which may lead to assessment for Autism and/or ADHD. Information about the GDA pathway can be found here GDA Pathway
